LA TOURNÉE QUÉBEC CINÉMA VISITS BRITISH COLUMBIA RENOWNED GUESTS AND EXCLUSIVE SCREENINGS OF QUEBEC FILMS



Montreal, January 22, 2019 – From **January 28** to **February 10**, **La Tournée Québec Cinéma** will visit **Nelson**, **Kelowna**, **Victoria**, **Vancouver** and **Nanaimo** to screen short and feature films for the region's cinephiles. The initiative, launched 15 years ago, remains the biggest French-language film event in Canada outside Quebec, with many films presented in exclusive screenings. The 2019 tour is also bringing accomplished filmmakers to its screenings to field guestions from the audience.

EXCLUSIVE SCREENINGS AND SPECIAL GUESTS

The screenings begin on **January 28** in **Nelson**, with **La disparition des lucioles** by Sébastien Pilote. The film's sound designer, **Olivier Calvert**, will be there to meet the audience after the film.

Two days later, the Tournée will arrive in **Kelowna** with actress **Catherine Sénart** for a screening of **Pieds nus dans l'aube.** The next day, **Les faux tatouages** will be shown, followed by a videoconference Q&A with director **Pascal Plante**.

On **January 30**, the Tournée will land in **Victoria** with six films to show. Two features will be screened as part of a partnership with the French-language program. **Claire l'hiver** by **Sophie Bédard Marcotte** and **Modifié** by **Aube Giroux** are the films to be shown, and both will be followed by videoconference Q&A sessions with their respective directors.

Then, the Victoria Film Festival will present four Quebec films from February 1 to 3. The series starts on February 1st with *Les salopes ou le sucre naturel de la peau* by Renée Beaulieu, which is sure to spark a lively discussion on women's sexuality in the post-#metoo world. The next day, February 2, *Chien de garde* by Sophie Dupuis will be shown with producer Étienne Hansez in attendance. The screening will be followed by a reception co-hosted by the Société francophone de Victoria. Lastly, on February 3, there will be two exclusive screenings: the premiere of *La grande noirceur* by Maxime Giroux, with the director present; and *La disparition des lucioles* by On, winner of the award for best feature at the 2018 Toronto International Film Festival; producer Marc Daigle will attend the screening.

The Tournée will continue its journey on **February 7**, heading to **Nanaimo** to present **1991** by Ricardo Trogi. The film was the top domestic earner at the Quebec box office in 2018.

From February 2 to 8, during the 25th annual Rendez-vous du cinéma québécois et francophone, Vancouver's francophone community will have the chance to see the above-mentioned films. Six films will have exclusive screenings. Among those, *Chien de garde* from Sophie Dupuis will be screened February 3. Two days later, *Une colonie* by Geneviève Dulude-De Celles, a multiple award-winner at the most recent Whistler Film Festival, including the award for best direction. February 6, La disparition des lucioles by Sébastien Pilote will be screened with actor Francois Papineau attending for a Q&A session. The next day, the film *Les Salopes ou le sucre naturel de la peau* by Renée Beaulieu will be shown to the public. Last but not least, *Les faux tatouages*, the first film by Pascal Plante, a love story with two charismatic leads, Anthony Therrien (Corbo) and Rose-Marie Perreault. The film earned the Grand Prix Focus Québec/Canada award at last fall's Festival du Nouveau Cinéma (Montreal). Filmmakers Renée Beaulieu and Maxime Giroux will participate in the screenings, as will *Chien de garde* producer Étienne Hansez.

In light of recent government cutbacks, the Tournée is particularly grateful to the Conseil culturel et artistique francophone de Colombie-Britannique, the government of British Columbia, the Victoria Film Festival, the University of Victoria, the Société francophone de Victoria, Visions Ouest Production, Les Rendez-vous du cinéma québécois et francophone, the Centre culturel de l'Okanagan, the Association des francophones des Kootenays Ouest, the Association des francophones de Nanaimo, the Landmark theatre and Expression Theatre Café for their commitment and support. Québec Cinéma also thanks the artists who are travelling with the Tournée to promote francophone culture across Canada.

THE TOURNÉE TURNS 15

Since its inception, the Tournée has travelled more than 170,000 kilometres, bringing Quebec's films and francophone culture to audiences. On its journeys, the Tournée has screened more than 700 films representing every genre, introduced 450 artists working in several film disciplines to audiences, and reached 107,000 spectators across Canada. This 15th season, already well under way, will keep showcasing Quebec's films throughout 2019 in every Canadian province outside Quebec, as well as Yukon. At the same time, the Lab Québec Cinéma will visit schools in Western Canada to present workshops and discussions for students. In just over 15 years, Québec Cinéma's educational activities have reached some 80,000 primary, secondary and cégep students with nearly 450 films and hundreds of opportunities to talk film with industry professionals. New this year: the Lab team will help train teachers through a program called Études de Cinéma et de littérature francophones. So far, five Vancouver schools have expressed their intention to participate in the program.

RAISING AUDIENCE AWARENESS OF INDIGENOUS CINEMA

For the last three years, La Tournée Québec Cinéma has presented films produced by the Wapikoni Mobile, an initiative that has earned well-deserved success. For this project, the Tournée presents short

films by First Nations filmmakers, with the aim of raising audience awareness of a still relatively unknown filmmaking community. There are also Q&A sessions with indigenous filmmakers.
